Watershed: is the area of land that carries water from the land after rain falls and snow melts through the soil, groundwaters, creeks and streams making its way into larger rivers and eventually the ocean. Rainwater picks up pollutants along the way!

What is the Yellow Fish Road Program?

- A program designed to help create awareness about the pollution that enters our storm drains, and that lead directly to the Oldman River!
- Painting yellow fish by storm drains as a visual reminder that "Rainwater Only" belongs in our storm drains.
- Hanging door hangers to create awareness in your neighbourhood.



Anything that is not rainwater:

- Affects the quality of our water.
- Creates a habitat that is hard for aquatic life to live in.
- Increases nutrients in the water, creating algal blooms.
- Is a type of **non-point source pollution**, which is pollution spread over a large area and not from one specific location or source; this type of pollution is hard to trace to its source.
